

During this inspection, certain of your activities, as described below and/or attached, were in violation of NRC requirements and are being cited in accordance with the NRC Enforcement Policy. This form is a NOTICE OF VIOLATION, which may be subject to posting in accordance with 10 CFR 19.11. (Violations and Corrective Actions)			
10 CFR 20.1801 requires that the licensee secure from unauthorized removal or access licensed materials that are stored in controlled or unrestricted areas. Contrary to the above, in August 2010, the licensee did not secure from unauthorized removal or limit access to three Itemizers, each containing 10 millicuries of Ni-63 located at Puerto Rico Army National Guard (PRARNG), which is a controlled area. The following corrective actions were taken: a search for the devices was performed in Puerto Rico and Florida; PRARNG personnel were re-trained on the proper method to ship excess material; PRARNG warehouse will correct its internal procedures as they apply to radioactive material identification and supply management coding; and PRARNG will conduct inventories twice a year. The licensee reviewed their internal radioactive materials database to ensure proper accountability of other such items and remaining ARNG units were notified of this event.

I hereby state that, within 30 days, the actions described by me to the Inspector will be taken to correct the violations identified. This statement of corrective actions is made in accordance with the requirements of 10 CFR 2.201 (corrective steps already taken, corrective steps which will be taken, date when full compliance will be achieved).
