This also refers to the letters dated May 21, 2012, (with attached Form NRC 314 dated May 22, 2012) from Saint Luke's Hospital of Chillicothe, d/b/a Hedrick Medical Center (HMC) and your letter dated June 1, 2012. These letters requested termination of the HMC license no. 24-32027-01, concurrent with its merger into this license, 24-00889-01.

This amendment incorporates the HMC's licensed program into your license as requested. The docket number for the HMC license has been added to Subitem No. 5 of your license for continuity's sake. The amendment terminating the HMC license is being transmitted under separate cover to HMC's management.

In the course of this review, we noted that you did not submit any facility diagrams for the HMC licensed program. In the absence of these diagrams, we concluded that the Radiation Safety Committee for your Type A Broad scope license will be promptly evaluating and approving/disapproving, as appropriate, the facilities for the HMC program, as well as HMC's authorized users, and the rest of its radiation safety program elements.

If our understanding is incorrect, please contact me immediately as noted above.

NRC's Regulatory Issue Summary (RIS) 2005-31 provides criteria to identify security-related sensitive information and guidance for handling and marking of such documents. This ensures that potentially sensitive information is not made publicly available through ADAMS, the NRC's electronic document system.

Since serious consequences to employees and the public can result from failure to comply with NRC requirements, prompt and vigorous enforcement action will be taken when dealing with licensees who do not achieve the necessary meticulous attention to detail and the high standard of compliance which NRC expects of its licensees.
