It is my understanding that the NRC is considering numerous issues in connection with the license renewal application for Indian Point Units 2 and 3 (NRC Docket Nos. 50-247-LR and 50-286-LR ASLBP No. 07-858-03-LR-BD01), and is accepting public comments as they make their decision.

I am the Executive Director of the Boys & Girls Club of Northern Westchester, a youth-serving organization with 2,000 members and an average attendance of 600 children per day. We receive substantial financial support from Entergy, with grants in recent years totaling more than \$300,000.

Entergy is a good corporate citizen, supporting many local charities, with nearly \$1.5 in annual donations in our area. Indian Point's significant positive impact on the local economy and non-profit organizations are factors that help maintain land values in the communities near the plant. Those values would surely decrease and the job loss would be significant if the facilities were closed, as would the area's quality of life if that substantial amount of corporate support to community-based charities was to end.

Having personally toured the plant, I am impressed with the company's commitment to safety, and trust that they will continue to consider the public's safety as their utmost concern moving forward. Thank you for considering my comments on this issue.
