I live in Chappagua New York with my husband and three sons. We feel that Indian Point poses a danger to our family and community and would like to not see it relicensed. We are very concerned that this plant is aging and like a car, they don't last forever. We hope that the officials at the NRC understand that there is a limit to how long this plant should be kept going and that they should keep in mind how much radioactive waste is accumulating on site. There is now more than 1,500 tons of radioactive waste stored in unfortified containers. How much more do we want to accumulate there? And Yucca Mountain isn't being considered at this point along with why should other states live with this radioactive threat also? There is no workable evacuation plan!! And we are in the evacuation zone and we know that if something happened we wouldn't be able to get out, and the thought of hunkering down or sheltering for weeks while the radiation slowly dissipates is absolutely unrealistic. The whole area would be destroyed from radioactive contamination which is impossible to clean up. We don't need the power A 2011 study commissioned by Riverkeeper and NRDC found that without Indian Point, the region would have a surplus of power through 2020 and could replace Indian Point many times over with investments in renewable energy, efficiency and transmission. The cost would be \$1-\$5 dollars per month for a typical homeowner.

Please listen to the people in the community. Mostly think about the radioactive waste!! Our children and grandchildren are already going to be left with the problem of storing this dangerous material. Let's not make it even worse for them!!!
