I am writing to state my strong opposition to the renewal of the operating license for the outdated dinosaur of a power plant known as Indian Point. With 20 million people living within 50 miles of this plant, do you realize the consequences of a serious radiological release? I live 10 miles from this 1960's era plant, and my home in the historic Hudson Valley could become uninhabitable.

Everyone agrees that even a new, latest-generation nuclear reactor would never be built at Indian Point's present location today due to population and seismic considerations, and yet Entergy Corp. thinks it's a good idea to continue operation of one that is 40 years old. The ultimate purpose of a relicensing process is to reconsider whether it is still in the public interest to allow continued operation, and it is clearly not.

Please do what is in the public interest, and deny new licenses to Indian Point.
