9/13/2012 (13:45) I spoke with Mr. Rogers about the pending expiration of the company's NRC license. Mr. Rogers stated that he was aware that the license was expiring and had informed his management. His management, however, had not made a decision on whether to renew the license or terminate it. Mr. Rogers stated that the gauges have not been used outside the State of New Jersey in a number of years. I informed Mr. Rogers that the regulations in 10 CFR 30.36 require that the licensee request renewal or termination of its license, at least, 30 days prior to the expiration date. In the licensee's case, this cut-off date would be August 31, 2012. Regional policy has been to accept renewal requests beyond the cut-off date but the licensee should get in as soon as possible or the application will be treated as a new license and will be feed accordingly. Mr. Rogers was familiar with our web site and I informed him the application for portable gauge licensees could be found in NUREG-1556, Vol. 1, Appendix C. Mr. Rogers stated that he would reappraise his management of the urgency of the matter and would see to it that a request to renew or terminate the license was sent to the NRC.
