EVALUATION OF HONEYWELL METROPOLIS WORKS'S REQUEST TO
TRANSFER MATERIALS UNDER TITLE 10 OF THE *CODE OF FEDERAL
REGULATIONS* 40.13, UNIMPORTANT QUANTITIES OF SOURCE MATERIAL

Dear Mr. Smith:

By letter dated July 30, 2012 (Agencywide Documents Access and Management System [ADAMS] Accession Number ML11220A011), Honeywell Metropolis Works (Honeywell) submitted its notification to the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) of its intention to transfer annually for disposal, over a period of 10 years, 90,000 cubic feet of debris contaminated with unimportant quantities of source material to the US Ecology Idaho facility near Grand View, Idaho. The Honeywell notification necessitated a review by NRC to ensure that this transfer would not pose a concern to public health and safety.

By letter dated September 21, 2012, the NRC approved the transfer described in Honeywell's July 30, 2012, notification letter. That action terminates our efforts and Technical Assignment Control Number L32787 has been closed.

In accordance with Title 10 of the *Code of Federal Regulations* 2.390 of the NRC's "Rules of Practice," a copy of this letter will be available electronically for public inspection in the NRC Public Document Room or from the Publicly Available Records Systems component of ADAMS.
