Dear Colonel Callahan:

This concerns the subject application for an amendment to your material license. Upon reviewing the amendment request, we have determined that additional information is required to complete the action. In order to continue with our review we will need the following:

1. review Item 6. of your current license and indicate which material should remain on the license,
2. provide an inventory of all byproduct material currently possessed (actively used and in waste),
3. provide disposal documentation (shipping papers and leak test results) for any sealed sources and unsealed material that you wish to remove from your current license, and
4. identify any byproduct material that is currently at the WRAMC Forest Glen Section and Annex Buildings 513 and 516, Silver Spring, Maryland.

Because it may take some time to gather the required information, we have voided the current request. This action is taken without prejudice to the resubmission of a new amendment request. Once the above information is obtained, resubmit your request to decrease the possession limits to amounts below the threshold necessary to provide financial assurance.
