

Field Office Inspection

Temporary Job Site Inspection

PROGRAM SCOPE

This was a routine inspection of a licensee in Southfield, Michigan. The licensee is a small cardiology clinic that is staffed with one nuclear medicine technologist (NMT). The NMT performs approximately nine procedures per day using unit doses. The clinic receives its unit doses from the local nuclear pharmacy.

Performance Observations

The inspection consisted of tour of the facility and independent measurements. The inspector interviewed the radiation safety officer (RSO), and closed the previous violation from the routine safety inspection performed in 2008. At the time of the inspection, the NMT had left for vacation. However, the inspector was able to interview the NMT the following week. The NMT appeared knowledgeable regarding radiation safety, and waste handling techniques. The inspector also performed an in office review of additional inspection documents such as training records, instrument calibration records, and dosimetry records. The inspector performed an telephone exit with the licensee on October 3, 2012.

No violations of NRC requirements were identified for this inspection.
