This refers to your license amendment request. Enclosed with this letter is the amended license naming Mr. Berkley as your Radiation Safety Officer. We noted in your letter that Camden Clark Medical Center was referenced as the name of the facility instead of Camden-Clark Memorial Hospital currently listed on your NRC license. If there has been a name change, please immediately submit the information described in Appendix F of NUREG-1556, Vol. 15 and describe if there has been a change in ownership.

Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand and fully implement all the conditions incorporated into the amended license.
