10 CFR 35.14(b)(5) requires, in part, that the licensee shall notify the Commission no later than 30 days after the licensee has added to or changed the areas of use identified in the application or on the license where byproduct material is used in accordance with either 10 CFR 35.100 or 35.200. Contrary to the above, Robert M. Smith, M.D., did not notify NRC within 30 days after adding an area of use identified on the license. Specifically, between November 2010 and September 26, 2012, a lock box used to store radioactive material packages delivered by the radiopharmacy before normal business hours, was added to an area of their facility, and the NRC was not notified. Robert M. Smith, M.D., sent a notification on September 26, 2012, to amend their license to include this location as part of their facilities.
