# SAFETY EVALUATION REPORT Docket No. 71-9270 NAC-UMS Universal Transportation Package Certificate of Compliance No. 9270 Revision No. 4

### **SUMMARY**

By application dated September 19, 2012, NAC International, requested renewal of Certificate of Compliance (CoC) No. 9270, for the Model No. NAC-UMS Universal Transportation Package. The certificate has been renewed for a 5- year term that expires on October 31, 2017.

# **EVALUATION**

By application dated September 19, 2012, NAC International, requested renewal of Certificate of Compliance No. 9270, for the Model No. NAC-UMS Universal Transportation Package.

The NAC-UMS Universal Transportation Package is approved to ship pressurized-water reactor spent nuclear fuel from Maine Yankee with a maximum burn-up no greater than 50 GWd/MTU. Given staff's concerns with the effects of hydride reorientation on high burn-up spent fuel rods as described in Interim Staff Guidance (ISG) 11, Rev. 3, staff has not yet stated a position on the continued approval of transportation packages shipping this content. In the CoC, condition 5.(b)(1)(iii)(B) requires that the high burn-up fuel meet certain requirements or else must be considered damaged fuel. In place of trying to meet the requirements, Maine Yankee considered the fuel as damaged and canned the fuel, thus alleviating the concerns in ISG-11.

The staff reviewed the documents referenced in the certificate and determined that the documentation was available and complete.

#### CONDITIONS

The following changes have been made to the certificate of compliance:

Condition No. 10 has been updated to reflect an expiration date of October 31, 2017.

The references section has been updated to include this renewal request.

Minor formatting changes have been made; however, no text beyond what is described above has been changed.

#### CONCLUSION

The certificate has been renewed for a 5-year term that expires on October 31, 2017. This change does not affect the ability of the package to meet the requirements of 10 CFR Part 71.
