General Comment

My late father, Peter J. Ferrara, who graduated from the Yale School of Engineering in 1934 (then called Sheffield) and was then declared "essential" by Union Carbide Corporation (which later had to be rescued and hidden within DOW Chemical Corporation because of the shameful Bhopal incident) was assigned to the manufacture of the first atomic bomb in Oak Ridge TN, where I spent part of my childhood. With his personal knowledge of the dangers of radiation, he testified against the building of the Indian Point nuclear facility in the 1960's, and I can hear him today saying that the dangers at that plant - and the shameful profit-oriented decisions made by the NRC which is much too close to corporate interests - continue to threaten the surrounding civilian populations as well as the Hudson River environment. Need I say more?
