Kathy,

Per our conversation yesterday, at this time Colorado does not plan to adopt the requirements of 10 CFR Part 32.201 (item 3 of NRC RATS 2006-2). Colorado does not currently have any radioactive materials licensees who manufacture Category 1 or Category 2 radioactive sources.

In the future, should Colorado license any entities for manufacture of Category 1 or Category 2 sources, we will initiate regulatory efforts to implement the requirements of 10 CFR Part 32.201.

Additionally, I would like to confirm that Colorado has previously incorporated the requirements of RATS 2006-2, Item 2 (definition for "Nationally tracked sources"). Item 2 of RATS 2006-2 may be found in Colorado Part 1, which became effective 4/30/2011.
