This letter refers to your license amendment request dated October 24, 2012, to add the former facility of David S. Grubbs, M.D., License No. 07-31076-01, as an additional authorized location of use to your NRC license. Enclosed with this letter is the amended license.

Please note that you are required, pursuant to 10 CFR 35.14 (b)(5), to notify the NRC no later than 30 days after you have added to or changed areas where radioactive materials permitted by 35.100 and 25.200 are used. Therefore, please submit your final facility diagram and shielding specifications to the NRC for review no later than 30 days after completion.

Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand and fully implement all the conditions incorporated into the amended license. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Region I Office, Licensing Assistance Team, (610) 337-5239, so that we can provide appropriate corrections and answers.

An environmental assessment for this action is not required, since this action is categorically excluded under 10 CFR 51.22(c)(14).
