Having the meeting webcast for those that cannot attend is unacceptable and she feels that this tactic discourages the public. She would like someone on behalf of the NRC to provide her with a detailed explanation as to why the meeting is being held in Maryland versus California. Otherwise she will write a complaint letter to President Barack Obama.
