Dear Mr. Jensen:

This is in reference to your NRC Form 314 dated October 31, 2012 requesting to amend Nuclear Regulatory Commission License No. 39-31336-01. In order to continue our review, we need the following additional information:

1. According to your NRC Form 314, the company name is SLI Havells, however from a recent inspection it was determined to be Havells USA Inc. and that it was a name change from SLi Lighting Products Inc. Please confirm that the licensee's name is Havells USA Inc. and that it was a name change from SLi Lighting Products Inc.
2. You did not include any item in the surveys performed and provided section of the submitted NRC Form 314. If a survey was not performed, please provide an assessment to why the facility will meet 10 CFR 20 and Subpart E. For example you could state that no product was broken or if any product was broken that it would be contained inside the products container there by precluding areas greater than 10 CFR 20, Subpart E.
3. You did not provide a license number that the material was transferred. Please include the Georgia materials license that the material was transferred.
