Dear Ms. DeRonde:

By letter dated May 21, 2012, the US Army Corp of Engineers (ACOE), Baltimore District forwarded to PPL Nuclear Development a copy of all comments received in response to a Public Notice (PN-12-07) related to their consideration of issuing a Clean Water Act Section 404 permit for the proposed Bell Bend project.

I am providing you with a copy of PPL Nuclear Development's responses to the ACOE to address the concerns you raised during the public comment period (Enclosure 1).

A Clean Water Act (CWA) Section 404 permit will allow the Bell Bend Project to discharge dredged or fill material into Waters of the United States.

The ACOE has stated that, "The decision whether to issue a permit will be based on an evaluation of the probable impacts, including cumulative impacts of the proposed activity on the public interest. That decision will reflect the national concern for both protection and utilization of important resources. The benefit, which reasonably may be expected to accrue from the proposal, must be balanced against its reasonably foreseeable detriments. All factors, which may be relevant to the proposal will be considered, including the cumulative effects thereof; among those are conservation, economic, aesthetics, general environmental concerns, wetlands, cultural values, fish and wildlife values, flood hazards, flood plain values, land use, navigation, shoreline erosion and accretion, recreation, water supply and conservation, water quality, energy needs, safety, food and fiber production, mineral needs, and consideration of property ownership and in general, the needs and welfare of the people."

The ACOE Public Notice is only a summary of PPL Nuclear Development's plans with regard to matters under their jurisdiction. Much more detail regarding the plans has been provided to the ACOE in our application for the 404 permit.
