I live within 13 miles of Diablo Nuclear Plant in San Luis Obispo County. I have concerns about the multiple earthquake faults intersecting and impacting this site. These factors underscore and intensify my interest in rules pertaining to the storage of spent fuel.

Careful consideration must be given to each particular site before any approvals are granted for storage. Every site has unique geographic characteristics which can severely amplify unforeseeable events. After Japan, this point is quite clear.
