SUBJECT: CALL BETWEEN NRC AND LICENSEE ON THE PLANNING OF THE  
FIRST FINAL STATUS SURVEY INSPECTION OF WESTINGHOUSE  
HEMATITE FORMER FUEL MANUFACTURING FACILITY

On January 28, 2013 the licensee and the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) RIII had a telephone conversation discussing the planning for the first final status survey (FSS) inspection of the Westinghouse Hematite former fuel manufacturing facility (licensee). Specifically, the licensee requested that the NRC perform the initial FSS inspection between February 18 and March 8, 2013.

The NRC inspectors discussed with the licensee the coordination with contract personnel from Oak Ridge Associated Universities (ORAU), who will assist the NRC inspectors in performing surveys and sampling. The NRC stated the week of March 4, 2013 had the appropriate resources available from both the NRC and ORAU to perform the required inspection activities. The licensee responded by stating that the week of March 4, 2013 was reasonable with their current schedule and if anything changed, they would call the NRC as soon as possible to discuss potential rescheduling of the inspection. The NRC stated that if the licensee were to request the NRC to reschedule the inspection, necessary resources would most likely not be available for a period of at least 3 weeks following the current planned week of March 4, 2013. The licensee acknowledged this potential delay if rescheduling was necessary.
