Hi Jennifer,

Thank you for your time today, we appreciate your efforts to help us.

I'm writing a note to summarize our conference call today. In summary, Technetics Group needs to make a decision on splitting up four end use applications. As we understand it, if we split up the end uses, then the one that has proper assurances supplied will most probably be approved within a month or so. The license request XCOM1240 would be granted for that End Use only. In addition, there will be no additional time delays for resubmittal of the other three end uses. In each of the three end uses pulled from the license, we will have to wait the same amount of time for the assurances that we would have if we left them bundled in XCOM1240. The advantage for splitting them up is that we cannot move forward with the one end use for which we have assurances unless all of them are approved.

So, it's a question of money for the application fees and not a question of additional time.

We will get together here and decide what we need to do.

Thank you for your timely response. If you split them up into different applications now, there would be the additional processing fee for the new application(s) (you could put the three entities on one Form 7 for \$9600 or do them separately for \$9600 each). Credit would not be applied to any new applications that may come out of this. It is a business decision on your part, please let me know how you would like us to proceed. From the Embassy, it sounded like the Chinese were ready to provide assurances for China First Heavy Industries and so we could move forward issuing that license in the next month or so (once received).

Hi Jennifer,

We originally included all four projects on one license because we were under the impression that the license application fees would be less. In this case, the license fee was \$9500.

If we split them up, then I would guess that we would have to reapply for the individual consignees. What would be the cost for the application of the individual consignees? Would we get a credit applied to the individual licenses?

Unfortunately, we did not anticipate that it would take well over 1 year for the license to be stuck in limbo.

As a result, we are in a pretty serious commercial situation. We may need to rethink things because we don't want to punish one customer because another hasn't responded.
