This letter serves as the final evaluation for Dr. James Sheperd, a resident in the Diagnostic Radiology Residency Program in the Department of Radiology with the College of Medicine at the University of Florida.

Dr. Sheperd completed his transitional internship from July 1, 2005 through June 30, 2006 at the University of Hawaii. He began his residency in Diagnostic Radiology with the College of Medicine at the University of Florida on July 1, 2006, and is scheduled to complete his training on June 30, 2010.

During his first two years of residency, Dr. Sheperd consistently had very good evaluations and was described by faculty as "very responsible and hard worker" and "Outstanding interpersonal interactions and overall performance on call." He passed the American Board of Radiology (ABR) Physics examination without difficulty on his first attempt in September 2007.

During his third year of residency, Dr. Sheperd continued to demonstrate excellent performance with all faculty evaluations at the "competent" or "above competent" level. Faculty described his performance as "Excellent resident who functions at the level of a fellow" and "attributes include a deep caring for the patients and staff. His interpersonal skills are excellent and he has a strong work ethic. He will be missed."

Throughout his training, Dr Sheperd has proven to be an outstanding resident. Solid academic performance, demonstrated medical competence, a strong work ethic, and exceptional interpersonal skills are all attributes that he possesses.

During his final year of training his evaluations have continued to be outstanding. He has been described by faculty as "A superior performer, excellent intellect. Jay is a terrific imager and I am proud to have had a small part in his development." and "would love to have him on my service every day". His 360 degree evaluations have been very good, and he has continued to consistently demonstrate a strong work ethic. He passed the ABR written board examination without difficulty on his first attempt. He recently passed all sections of the ABR oral board examination on his first attempt, qualifying him as a board-certified radiologist. He completed a total of 12 months of Interventional Radiology training during his residency.

Dr Sheperd has satisfactorily completed the requirements of an Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (ACGME) approved training program. This training has included a curriculum based on the ACGME six core competencies. Throughout his residency, and during the final period of education, he has demonstrated competent performance in the areas of Patient Care, Medical Knowledge, Practice-Based Learning and Improvement, Interpersonal and Communication Skills, Professionalism, and Systems-Based Practice. We verify that Dr Sheperd has demonstrated sufficient competence to enter practice without direct supervision.

Upon the completion of his residency, Dr. Sheperd is scheduled to begin a joint Breast Imaging/Body Imaging fellowship in the Department of Radiology with the University of Florida and Malcolm Randall Veteran's Hospital which includes staff responsibilities in Interventional Radiology. We are confident that he will excel in his continued training and become a valuable asset to the medical community.
