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Dear Chairwoman MacFarlane:

On behalf of the Placentia Chamber of Commerce, located in North Orange County and our 250+ business membership, I am writing to support a fair and inclusive regulatory process for the proposed restart plan and operation of the San Onofre Nuclear Generating Station ("SONGS") Unit 2.

The Chamber believes that Southern California Edison should be allowed to restart and operate SONGS as proposed in their Return-to-Service Action Plan, if the Nuclear Regulatory Commission ("NRC") determines they have sufficiently completed the compensatory and corrective actions requested in the March 27, 2012 Confirmatory Action Letter.

With the constant electricity demand, businesses in California will need even more clean, efficient and reliable electricity to run day and night without any interruptions. Our California economy is facing a tough uphill climb out of the current recession. 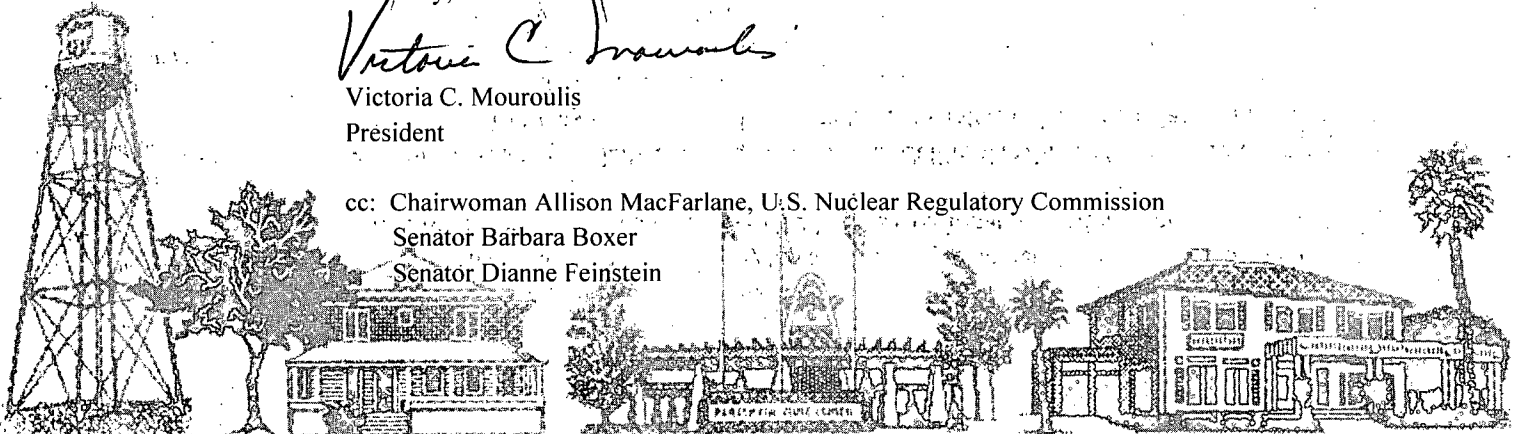
