The Application for Withholding is submitted by Westinghouse Electric Company, LLC (Westinghouse), pursuant to the provisions of Paragraph (b) (1) of Section 2.390 of the Commission's regulations. It contains commercial strategic information proprietary to Westinghouse and customarily held in confidence.

The proprietary material for which withholding is being requested is included in the proprietary versions of the subject reports. In conformance with 10 CFR Section 2.390, Affidavit AW-13-3608 accompanies this Application for Withholding, setting forth the basis on which the proprietary information may be withheld from public disclosure.

Accordingly, it is respectfully requested that the subject information which is proprietary to Westinghouse be withheld from public disclosure in accordance with 10 CFR Section 2.390 of the Commission's regulations.

The material for which withholding is being requested is also subjected to export control laws including the Export Administration Regulations (EAR), 15 CFR Part 730 and the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) 10 CFR 110. Transfer, retransfer or disclosure of this data by any means to a non-U.S. person (individual or company) whether in the United States or abroad, without any required export license or other approval from the U.S. Government is prohibited.





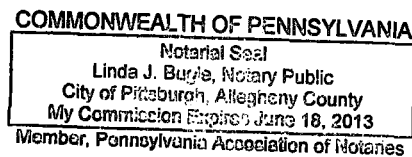

- (1) I am Program Manager Korea/UAE, Westinghouse Electric Company, LLC (Westinghouse), and as such, I have been specifically delegated the function of reviewing the proprietary information sought to be withheld from public disclosure in connection with nuclear power plant licensing and rule making proceedings, and am authorized to apply for its withholding on behalf of Westinghouse, SPX Corporation and Universal Propulsion Company.
- (2) I am making this Affidavit in conformance with the provisions of 10 CFR Section 2.390 of the Commission's regulations and in conjunction with the Westinghouse "Application for Withholding" accompanying this Affidavit.
- (3) I have personal knowledge of the criteria and procedures utilized by Westinghouse in designating information as a trade secret, privileged or as confidential commercial or financial information.
- (4) Pursuant to the provisions of paragraph (b)(4) of Section 2.390 of the Commission's regulations, the following is furnished for consideration by the Commission in determining whether the information sought to be withheld from public disclosure should be withheld.
 - (i) The information sought to be withheld from public disclosure is owned and has been held in confidence by Westinghouse, SPX Corporation and Universal Propulsion Company.
 - (ii) The information is of a type customarily held in confidence by Westinghouse and not customarily disclosed to the public. Westinghouse has a rational basis for determining the types of information customarily held in confidence by it and, in that connection, utilizes a system to determine when and whether to hold certain types of information in confidence. The application of that system and the substance of that system constitute Westinghouse policy and provide the rational basis required.

Under that system, information is held in confidence if it falls in one or more of several types, the release of which might result in the loss of an existing or potential competitive advantage, as follows:

- (a) The information reveals the distinguishing aspects of a process (or component, structure, tool, method, etc.) where prevention of its use by any of Westinghouse's competitors without license from Westinghouse constitutes a competitive economic advantage over other companies.

- (b) It consists of supporting data, including test data, relative to a process (or component, structure, tool, method, etc.), the application of which data secures a competitive economic advantage, e.g., by optimization or improved marketability.
- (c) Its use by a competitor would reduce his expenditure of resources or improve his competitive position in the design, manufacture, shipment, installation, assurance of quality, or licensing a similar product.
- (d) It reveals cost or price information, production capacities, budget levels, or commercial strategies of Westinghouse, its customers or suppliers.
- (e) It reveals aspects of past, present, or future Westinghouse or customer funded development plans and programs of potential commercial value to Westinghouse.
- (f) It contains patentable ideas, for which patent protection may be desirable.
- (g) This document is subjected to the EAR, ECCN 1E001. This information is subjected to the export control laws of the United States, specifically including the Export Administration Regulations (EAR), 10 CFR Part 730 et seq.
- (h) This document is subjected to the U.S. NRC. This information is subjected to the export control laws of the United States, specifically including the Nuclear Regulatory Commission Regulations (NRC), 10 CFR Part 110.

There are sound policy reasons behind the Westinghouse system which include the following:

- (a) The use of such information by Westinghouse gives Westinghouse a competitive advantage over its competitors. It is, therefore, withheld from disclosure to protect the Westinghouse competitive position.

- (b) It is information that is marketable in many ways. The extent to which such information is available to competitors diminishes the Westinghouse ability to sell products and services involving the use of the information.
- (c) Use by our competitor would put Westinghouse at a competitive disadvantage by reducing his expenditure of resources at our expense.
- (d) Each component of proprietary information pertinent to a particular competitive advantage is potentially as valuable as the total competitive advantage. If competitors acquire components of proprietary information, any one component may be the key to the entire puzzle, thereby depriving Westinghouse of a competitive advantage.
- (e) Unrestricted disclosure would jeopardize the position of prominence of Westinghouse in the world market, and thereby give a market advantage to the competition of those countries.
- (f) The Westinghouse capacity to invest corporate assets in research and development depends upon the success in obtaining and maintaining a competitive advantage.
- (g) This document is subjected to the EAR, ECCN 1E001. This information is subjected to the export control laws of the United States, specifically including the Export Administration Regulations (EAR), 10 CFR Part 730 et seq. Transfer, retransfer or disclosure of this data by any means to a non-U.S. person (individual or company) whether in the United States or abroad, without any required export license or other approval from the U.S. Government is prohibited.
- (h) This document is subjected to the U.S. NRC. This information is subjected to the export control laws of the United States, specifically including the Nuclear Regulatory Commission Regulations (NRC), 10 CFR Part 110. - (v) The proprietary information sought to be withheld in this submittal is that which is included in Review of Proprietary Documents to Support the Meeting with Southern Nuclear Operating Company, South Carolina Electric and Gas and Westinghouse Electric Company on the AP1000 Squib Valve Issues. These documents are being transmitted by Westinghouse letter (DCP_NRC_003238) and Application for Withholding Proprietary Information from Public Disclosure in support of Westinghouse and sub-vendor activities. The proprietary information as submitted by Westinghouse is expected to be applicable in other licensee submittals in response to certain NRC requirements for justification of compliance with regulations.

This information is part of that which will enable Westinghouse to:

- (a) Manufacture and deliver products to utilities based on proprietary system designs.
- (b) Advance the AP1000 Design and reduce the licensing risk for the application of the AP1000 Design Certification
- (c) Determine compliance with regulations and standards
- (d) Establish design requirements and specifications for the system.

Further this information has substantial commercial value as follows:

- (a) Westinghouse plans to sell the use of similar information to its customers for purposes of plant construction and operation.
- (b) Westinghouse can sell support and defense of safety systems based on the technology in the reports.
- (c) The information requested to be withheld reveals the distinguishing aspects of an approach and schedule which was developed by Westinghouse.

Public disclosure of this proprietary information is likely to cause substantial harm to the competitive position of Westinghouse because it would enhance the ability of competitors to provide similar digital technology safety systems and licensing defense services for commercial power reactors without commensurate expenses. Also, public disclosure of the information would enable others to use the information to meet NRC requirements for licensing documentation without purchasing the right to use the information.

The development of the technology described in part by the information is the result of applying the results of many years of experience in an intensive Westinghouse effort and the expenditure of a considerable sum of money.

In order for competitors of Westinghouse to duplicate this information, similar technical programs would have to be performed and a significant manpower effort, having the requisite talent and experience, would have to be expended.
