MATTER AT USEC HEADQUARTERS (TECHNICAL ASSIGNMENT CONTROL

Dear Mr. Toelle:

I am responding to Mr. John A. Wiedner's letter dated April 5, 2012 (GDP 12-0015), requesting U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) review and approval of Revision 13 of the Security Program for Handling Classified Matter at the United States Enrichment Corporation (USEC) the Corporation's Headquarters. The revision to the security program involved changes to implement the requirements and format of the Standard Practice Procedures Plan, "Standard Format and Common Set of Requirements for the Protection of Classified Matter for USEC Inc. and its Limited Liability Companies Regulated by the NRC," and to implement the additional voluntary requirements of the Nuclear Energy Institute document NEI 08-11, "Information Security Program Guidelines for Protection of Classified Matter at Uranium Enrichment Facilities."

By letter dated July 18, 2012, the NRC transmitted a request for additional information (RAI). The Corporation submitted its responses to the RAI by letter dated August 15, 2012 (GDP 12-0028). The NRC evaluated the Corporation's responses and, by letter dated February 1, 2013, requested the Corporation to provide responses to additional questions that resulted from the NRC's evaluation of the Corporation's responses to the RAI. By letter dated February 20, 2013 (GDP 13-0004), the Corporation provided its responses to the NRC's, February 20, 2013, additional questions.

We have completed our review of your request. Based on the information provided, the NRC staff concluded that the proposed changes are acceptable. Therefore, Revision 13 of the Security Program for handling classified matter at the Corporation's headquarters is approved. The NRC will capture this revision in a future license amendment of materials license number SNM-2011 for the American Centrifuge Plant.

This action completes the effort on Technical Assignment Control Number L34155.
