Workshops are designed in six subject areas: Indian Country and Federal Indian Law, Equal Employment Opportunity and Human Resources, Indigenous Natural and Culture Resources, Leadership and Professional Development, and Wellness and Health. Networking opportunities with tribal and governmental leadership abound over the course of the Training Program.

SAIGE hosts an all-expense paid Youth Program designed to develop AI/AN college students into the next generation of leaders and introduce them to prosperous and fulfilling career paths in Government. 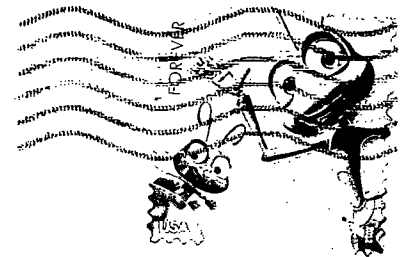
The SAIGE National Training Program early registration fee is \$600 online by April 19; \$650 to pre-register online by May 17; \$700 for late or on-site registration.
