3/14/2013 (07:35) I spoke with Mr. McNamee about the content of the licensee's reply to the Notice of Violation enclosed with the NRC's February 11, 2013, letter. I explained that the two violations described in the licensee's letter were actually the same violation concerning the decommissioning of the 73 Cogwheel Lane, Seymour, Connecticut facility. The second violation cited by the NRC was actually a failure on the part of the licensee to amend the license to accurately reflect the licensee's mailing address. Mr. McNamee stated that he had originally tried to amend the license when he paid the 2012 Annual Fees but was informed that he had to work with the regions rather than the NRC headquarters fees branch. Prior to sending in the request, Mr. McNamee stated that there were discussions with management to determine whether a request to terminate the license should be submitted. The decision to terminate the license was not reached until December 2012 and then the 2013 fee issues arose. I asked Mr. McNamee to fax in a letter restating the violation as a failure to submit an amendment to the license correcting the mailing address and then restating what he told me as the reason why the amendment request was not sent in. Mr. McNamee said that he would draft, sign and fax in a letter as described above. Mr. McNamee then asked me if I knew of any progress with the Annual Fee submission. I answered that I was unaware of anything beyond the March 12, 2013, e-mail which Lynn Bates sent out indicating that fees had not been received. I advised Mr. McNamee that an alternative method of payment could be a charge to a company credit card but he would have to make arrangements with Lynn Bates.
