ORDER

On June 24, 1994, General Atomics (GA) filed before the Commission a "Petition for Review of LBP-94-17 and/or Motion for Directed Certification." GA seeks interlocutory review of the Atomic Safety and Licensing Board's denial in LBP-94-17 (June 8, 1994) of GA's motion for summary disposition and dismissal of this proceeding. GA's June 24th petition exceeded the ten page limit normally applied to such filings. Consequently, GA filed on June 28 a motion for leave to exceed the page limitation. GA represents that no other party opposes its June 28th motion.

Native Americans for a Clean Environment (NACE) filed on June 29 a motion seeking an extension of time of four days for filing a response to GA's petition, indicating that NACE's agreement to extension of the page limitation was contingent on an extension of time for filing. In addition to the asserted burden of replying to GA's longer petition, NACE's counsel indicates that the period for filing a reply presently runs during the time that she will be out of town on a previously planned vacation.

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Upon consideration of the circumstances here, GA's motion for leave to exceed the page limitation is granted, and GA's June 24th petition is therefore accepted for filing. Pursuant to my authority in 10 C.F.R. § 2.772, any reply to GA's petition may be enlarged to no more than 15 pages in length. NACE's motion for an extension of time is also granted. A reply by NACE or any other party may be filed in accordance with the Commission's procedures no later than July 15, 1994.

It is so ORDERED.

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
