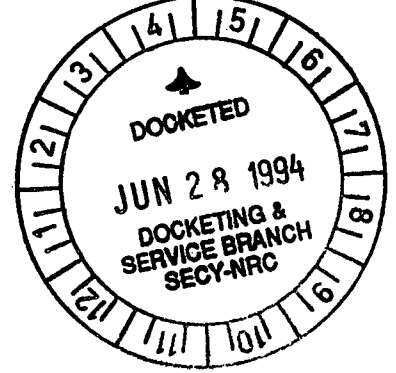

MOTION FOR LEAVE TO EXCEED PAGE LIMITATION

General Atomics hereby moves the Nuclear Regulatory Commission ("Commission") for leave to exceed the page limitation set forth in 10 C.F.R. § 2.786(b)(2). In support of this motion, General Atomics submits the following:

1. On June 24, 1994, General Atomics filed and served by U.S. mail upon all parties to this proceeding, its Petition for Review of LBP-94-17 and/or Motion for Directed Certification ("Petition"). An additional copy was filed by telecopy with the Secretary of the Commission on June 27, 1994.

2. The Petition is 14 1/2 pages in length.

3. On June 28, 1994, counsel for General Atomics telephoned counsel for each of the other parties and counsel for the Cherokee Nation to request their position on the question of whether or not they would oppose a request by General Atomics to exceed the 10 page limit. Counsel for the NRC Staff, Sequoyah Fuels Corporation, Native Americans for a Clean Environment, and the Cherokee Nation have all informed General Atomics that they do not oppose a grant of leave to General Atomics to exceed the 10 page limit.

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


