Minutes:

Mr. Huyck: opened the drop-in with introductions and a purpose statement. Doug queried why NEI was generating a new document related to security training.

Subject: Security-Related Training, 10 CFR Part 73, Appendix B

Summary:

Mr. Klein indicated that the current Regulatory Guide (RG) 5.75, "Training and Qualification of Security Personnel at Nuclear Power Reactor Facilities" was fine. NEI is coordinating with the sites and the sites are asked to justify their current training programs and identify performance objectives in their training program that could be enhanced. Mr. Klein related that NEI was aware of NRC staff's effort to update RG 5.75.

Mr. Asendorf highlighted current industry challenges regarding the implementation of the training rule and guidance. A task force was formed to prepare comments related to RG 5.75 when the document is made publically available for comment.

Mr. Asendorf related that if an inspector requested the document it would be made available. The document is not going to conflict with current rule language, RG 5.75 or NRC-approved security, training and qualification plans. The document is expected to provide a detailed process to address the guidance in RG 5.75 and the level of site management in security training programs.

Subject: Fitness for Duty, 10 CFR Part 26

Mr. Huyck provided a status of staff review concerning NEI 06-06, Fitness for Duty Program. Mr. Huyck estimated that the NRC staff's response, by letter, to NEI's 06-06 document should be released by the second week of April, 2013. The NRC staff are currently developing a regulatory guide that will endorse NEI's 06-06 document. The guide is projected for release for public comment during 3rd quarter, 2013.

Mr. Klein commented that industry fully agrees with the staff's direction regarding the Fitness for Duty regulatory guide and NEI 06-06.

Mr. Huyck closed the Drop-In.

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
