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## NRC MEETINGS IN ROCKVILLE, MD, APRIL 12 TO DISCUSS FUKUSHIMA LESSONS LEARNED, CONTAINMENT VENTING SYSTEMS

The Nuclear Regulatory Commission staff will hold separate meetings April 12 related to the lessons learned from the March 2011 nuclear accident in Fukushima, Japan.

The first meeting will cover general issues of schedules and guidance for actions stemming from the NRC's Japan Near-Term Task Force recommendations; the second will discuss specific issues related to enhancing requirements for venting systems at U.S. plants similar to those involved in the Fukushima accident.

Both meetings will be held in the Commission Hearing Room on the first floor of the NRC's White Flint complex at 11555 Rockville Pike in Rockville. The general meeting between senior NRC managers and industry executives will run from 9 a.m.-noon. The meeting on venting systems for "Mark I" and "Mark II" containments will run from 1-5 p.m. The public is invited to observe the meetings and offer comments or ask questions at specific points in the agenda.

Both meetings will include teleconferences; the general meeting will be [webcast](#) and the venting system meeting will include a webinar.
