

The U.S. Embassy will continue to update American citizens as the situation develops. U.S. citizens in need of emergency assistance, or persons with information about such individuals, can enter information about them through the Task Force Alert link on the Japan Earthquake/Tsunami site on www.travel.state.gov, and provide detailed information about their location and contact information. U.S. citizens in Japan and those concerned about them should monitor the U.S.Department of State website at travel.state.gov.

International commercial flights are operating in and out of Japan, and the best way for Americans to get on these flights is to work directly with the airlines. In addition, for those who have made it to the airport in Tokyo already, US consular officers will be available at the Narita airport for the next several days. They will be wearing orange vests that read "U.S. Embassy." In addition, the Depart ment of State is arranging charter flights from Tokyo to safehaven loc ations in Asia. Space on these flights is limited, and travelers will be required to sign a form promising to reimburse the U.S. government at the equivalent commercial rate. Bus Seats Available from Sendai: The U.S. Embassy in Tokyo has arranged for over 600 seats on several buses for transportation from Sendai City Hall to Tokyo. Priority for seats will be given to U.S. citizens and their immediate dependents. No reservation is required. However, passengers will be required to sign a promissory note to reimburse the U.S. Government for the normal bus fare from Sendai to Tokyo.

The first buses will depart at 9:00 a.m. on Friday, March 18 in front of Sendai City Hall (仙台市役所前広場). If there are extra seats left over, then the remaining buses will depart on 9:00 a.m. on Saturday, March 19 at the same location

GENERAL OVERVIEW OF AFTERMATH

President Obama visited the Japanese Embassy in Washington March 17 to deliver flowers and express sympathies on behalf of the American people. The President spoke on events in Japan this afternoon. The Japanese National Police Agency reported 5692 dead, 9522 missing, and 2383 injured.

Tokyo Electric Power Company (TEPCO) announced it was able to avoid implementing rolling blackouts in Tokyo and its surrounding area.

Toyota will suspend all production until March 22, Honda will suspend all production until March 20, and Nissan will stop production at four plants in Kanagawa Prefecture.

The Nikkei 225 Index dropped 131 points or 1.4 percent. Overall, in the past five sessions, the Index is down more than 14 percent.

Japanese Agriculture, Forestry, and Fisheries Minister Kano warned of a "food supply-demand imbalance" in the country &nbs p; Japan produces only 39 percent of its own food and will be even more dependent on foreign supplies.

Sendai Airport is now open to supply humanitarian efforts for Self Defense Forces (SDF) and U.S. military flights.

Delta Airlines reported while outbound flights from Japan are almost full, inbound traffic is nearly empty. &nb sp; Delta plans to temporarily suspend its Haneda service to Detroit and Los Angeles and focus on its Narita hub.

British Airways became the latest airline carrier to pull crews out of Tokyo. The UK is chartering flights from Tokyo to Hong Kong to supplement commercially available options for British nationals seeking to leave Japan.

The World Health Organization representative in China issued a statement to quell incre asing public concern.

NUCLEAR ISSUES

The Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) assesses secondary containment at the Fukushima Dai-ichi reactor No. 3 is severely damaged, primary containment at reactor No. 2 is damaged, half of fuel at reactor No. 1 is uncovered, the water level is dropping in the spent fuel pond and rods are heating up at reactor No. 5, and the water level in reactor No. 6 is lower than normal but not heating up. There is another spent fuel storage facility on site and its status is currently unknown.

IAEA Director General Amano and an expert mission traveled to Japan to conduct high-level consultations with Japanese authorities and respond to Japan's request for assistance in environmental monitoring and medical services. Amano asked the Board of Governors to meet March 21 in a special session so he could report on his by-then completed trip.

&nb sp:

The Department of Energy reports it continues to analyze data from manned air monitoring assets performing assessments since March 16 near the Fukushima Dai-ichi nuclear power plant.

The Tokyo Electric Power Company (TEPCO) estimates it will fix power cables by March 18 on the Fukushima Dai-ichi plant to supply power to the reactor coolant system and test power to reactor No. 2 once spraying of water on reactor No. 3 is completed.

At least 20 people have fallen ill due to possible radiation contamination, in addition to 19 injured and two missing at the Fukushima Dai-ichi plant.

CONSULAR ISSUES

The first U.S. government vo luntary authorized departure flight departed Tokyo at 1138 EDT and arrived at Taipei 1300 EDT. The total number of passengers on the plane was 96.

There are no reports of U.S. citizen fatalities. However, the Bureau of Consular Affairs reports several U.S. citizens remain unaccounted for in the most affected areas. The Bureau of Consular Affairs has contacted family members directly.

INTERNATIONAL ASSISTANCE AND RESPONSE

The Republic of Korea (ROK) assistance to Japan since March 11 has exceeded \$12.5 million, including 52 tons of boric acid, the primary material used to halt fission reaction at nuclear power plants.

French Interior Minister Gueant said France was prepared to welcom e Japanese nationals in need of care who could not be treated in Japan.

Embassy Paris reports French Finance Minister Lagarde will convene conference calls March 17 with finance ministers and central bankers from European and Group of 7 countries to assess economic effects and possible responses.

Canada advised all of its citizens within 50 miles of the Fukushima Dai-ichi plant to move farther from t he site, joining the United States in urging the wider evacuation zone. India advised its nationals to avoid non-essential travel to Japan. Air India also introduced daily flights in order to fly Indian citizens back. The People's Republic of China began bussing its nationals out of the affected areas, transporting citizens to where China Airlines flights operate.

KEY DEVELOPMENTS

- On April 7 at 1032 hours Eastern Daylight Time, or 2332 hours Japan Standard Time (JST), a magnitude 7.1 aftershock occurred off the east coast of Honshu Island—approximately 41 miles east of Sendai, Miyagi Prefecture, and 205 miles northeast of Tokyo—at a depth of 30 miles. The Japan Meteorological Agency issued a tsunami warning shortly after the event but cancelled the warning within 90 minutes. Non-governmental organizations operating locally reported that the earthquake temporarily affected electricity in some areas but resulted in limited damage. The Government of Japan (GoJ) National Police Agency (NPA) reported two deaths and 132 people injured as a result of the April 7 aftershock, which was the largest to occur since the March 11 earthquake. NPA also reported moderate road damage resulting from the aftershock.
- The March 11 earthquake and tsunami have resulted in nearly 13,000 deaths and left nearly 15,000 people missing, the GoJ reported on April 8. The natural disasters also damaged or destroyed more than 217,000 buildings and 2,100 roads.
- The number of people staying in evacuation centers continues to decrease, with approximately 154,000 people remaining in centers as of April 8. More than 18,000 people have left evacuation centers since March 31.

CONTEXT

- On March 11 at 0046 hours Eastern Standard Time, or 1446 hours JST, a magnitude 9.0 earthquake occurred off the east coast of Honshu Island—approximately 231 miles northeast of Tokyo—at a depth of approximately 15 miles, generating a tsunami that struck the eastern coast of Japan and resulted in additional fatalities and damage, particularly in Miyagi, Fukushima, and Iwate prefectures. Furthermore, the tsunami significantly damaged the Fukushima Daiichi power plant located approximately 150 miles north of Tokyo, leading to a serious nuclear incident.
- USAID immediately activated a Response Management Team in Washington, D.C., and deployed a Disaster
 Assistance Response Team (DART)—including urban search and rescue (USAR) specialists and nuclear
 experts—to support Japanese emergency response efforts. On March 11, U.S. Ambassador John V. Roos
 declared a disaster due to the effects of the earthquake and tsunami in Japan.

Humanitarian Situation and Response

- On April 7, NPA mobilized approximately 250 members of the Tokyo Metropolitan Police mobile unit to begin
 searching for missing persons within the GoJ-established 20-km exclusion zone surrounding the Fukushima
 Daiichi nuclear power plant. The officers joined approximately 50 local police who had been searching the area
 for four days for the more than 2,400 residents of the exclusion zone who remain missing.
- From April 1 to 3, Japan Self-Defense Force, U.S. Military, NPA, Japanese Coast Guard, and GoJ Fire and
 Disaster Management Agency personnel conducted an intensive search for human remains along the coastlines
 of Fukushima, Iwate, and Miyagi prefectures. The search resulted in a decreased number of persons listed as

- missing as remains were recovered. As many as 120 aircraft and 65 naval vessels participated in the search, according to the U.N. Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs.
- The GoJ Ministry of the Environment has estimated that the tsunami generated approximately 24.9 million tons
 of debris in Miyagi, Iwate, and Fukushima prefectures, representing 1.7 times the amount of debris that resulted
 from the 1995 Kobe earthquake. Cars and ships that washed away during the disaster are not included in this
 estimate.

Logistics and Relief Supplies

- On April 7, the GoJ Ministry of Economy, Trade, and Industry (METI) announced that the Petroleum
 Association of Japan (PAJ) has commenced shipments of petroleum for heating and lighting to affected areas.
 PAJ plans to ship 650 drums of petroleum per prefecture to Iwate, Miyagi, and Fukushima. Since March 27,
 METI has installed temporary gas stations in nine towns in the three prefectures and provided gasoline to 5,600
 vehicles.
- On April 7, the Tohoku Region Bureau of Economy, Trade, and Industry announced that the gasoline supply in Miyagi Prefecture has nearly returned to pre-March 11 levels, noting that local officials continue to work to restore roads and fuel stations in tsunami-affected coastal areas.
- Supermarkets and convenience stores in affected areas are replenishing supplies with increasing frequency as
 distribution networks return to normal, according to Japanese media reports. In several instances, companies
 have opened alternate distribution centers or leased new warehouses to enhance distribution chains and restore
 service to stores in affected prefectures.

Situation at Nuclear Power Plants

- The April 7 aftershock did not affect conditions at the Fukushima Daiichi and Fukushima Daini power plants. The aftershock affected electrical power at three other nuclear facilities in northern Japan, according to the DART. The Higashi-Dori power plant and Rokkasho spent fuel reprocessing plant, both in Aomori Prefecture, are currently operating on emergency diesel generators, and one of three primary power lines remains operational for cooling at the Onagawa power plant in Miyagi Prefecture.
- Staff from the U.S. Department of Energy, the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC), the U.S. Embassy
 in Tokyo, and the DART continue to actively monitor and analyze information on radiation levels in Tokyo. The
 NRC also continues to provide technical assistance to the U.S. Embassy in Tokyo and GoJ officials in support of
 assessment and mitigation efforts at the Fukushima Daiichi site.





Also attached is the participant listing from today's interagency conference with Hill staff. FYI, here is a brief summary of the call.

On April 12, Mark Bartolini (USAID OFDA Director) hosted the weekly interagency conference call with Congressional staff to update them on the current situation in Japan resulting from the earthquake, tsunami and nuclear situation. Bartolini pointed out that USAID's intent is to ramp down the relief operations over the next couple of weeks and transition to the mission in Japan, leaving the same players in country for the next two months. He noted that as of today the nuclear event has been upgraded and remains a serious concern. Julie Leonard (Manager of the interagency RMT) provided information on the latest aftershocks and total numbers of deaths, missing and injured. Other speakers on the call were Robert Spousta (DoD) who noted the shift in DoD operations from a relief focus to help the GOJ response following the lead of DOE and NRC. In response to a number of concerns about fish from Japan being consumed in the United States, Don Kraemer and Patricia Hansen (FDA) gave a full report on the three modes in which radiation contamination of fish may occur and the actions being taken by FDA in response to these concerns. He said they do not expect any negative impact, noting that the event in Japan is very different than Chernobyl. Jeff Nemkauser and Admiral Svenrodenbeck (HHS/CDC), Steve Wilson and John Sokich (NOAA), and Albert Coons (FEMA) were also available for questions. There were 14 Congressional staff participating on the call; all of their questions related to the possible fish contamination, including:



- What the device used by FDA field examiners is called (hand-held radiation pager).
- If the FDA is doing any monitoring and if there are agents with radiation pagers in the island territories.
- Who are the FDA sister agencies working in the island territories.
- If the only fish with elevated levels is called a sand eel or sand lance (same fish).
- Where the sand eels with elevated levels were detected.
- What are the concentration levels in the sand eel.
- Whether the sand eel is used as a fish in Japanese restaurants.
- Whether FDA has any advice for Japanese restaurants in California concerning the fish from Japan.
- Does FDA plan to communicate with the public about the fish issue since many questions are being raised.
- If there is a Web site available that people can be directed to for this information.
- If coordination with marketing institutions is being undertaken to let them know we are monitoring and tracking the risk concerning possible fish contamination.







KEY DEVELOPMENTS

- On April 11 at 1716 hours Japan Standard Time (JST), or 0416 hours Eastern Daylight Time (EDT), a magnitude 6.6 aftershock occurred in eastern Honshu—approximately 22 miles west of Iwaki, Fukushima Prefecture, and 161 miles northeast of Tokyo—at a depth of approximately 6 miles, according to the U.S. Geological Survey (USGS). The earthquake killed one person, disrupted power for approximately 220,000 households, and temporarily interrupted power and pumps used for cooling reactors 1, 2, and 3 at the Fukushima Daiichi site.
- On April 12 at 0808 hours JST, or 1908 hours EDT on April 11, a magnitude 6.2 aftershock occurred just off the
 east coast of Honshu—47 miles southeast of Tokyo—at a depth of approximately 8 miles. Minimal damage
 occurred due to the aftershock. USGS and the Japan Meteorological Agency noted that aftershocks of
 magnitudes above 6.0 will likely continue to occur regularly throughout the coming months.
- The March 11 earthquake and tsunami have resulted in more than 13,500 deaths and left nearly 15,000 people
 missing, the GoJ reported on April 15. The natural disasters also damaged or destroyed more than 217,000
 buildings and 2,100 roads.
- The number of people staying in evacuation centers continues to decrease, with approximately 138,000 people remaining in centers as of April 15. More than 16,000 people have left evacuation centers since April 8.

CONTEXT .

- On March 11 at 0046 hours Eastern Standard Time, or 1446 hours JST, a magnitude 9.0 earthquake occurred off
 the east coast of Honshu Island—approximately 231 miles northeast of Tokyo—at a depth of approximately 15
 miles, generating a tsunami that struck the eastern coast of Japan and resulted in additional fatalities and damage,
 particularly in Miyagi, Fukushima, and Iwate prefectures. Furthermore, the tsunami significantly damaged the
 Fukushima Daiichi power plant located approximately 150 miles north of Tokyo, leading to a serious nuclear
 incident.
- USAID immediately activated a Response Management Team in Washington, D.C., and deployed a Disaster
 Assistance Response Team (DART)—including urban search and rescue (USAR) specialists and nuclear
 experts—to support Japanese emergency response efforts. On March 11, U.S. Ambassador John V. Roos
 declared a disaster due to the effects of the earthquake and tsunami in Japan.

Humanitarian Situation and Response

- To address the psychosocial health of disaster-affected children, on April 13, the GoJ Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science, and Technology reported plans to deploy more than 1,000 additional school counselors to areas impacted by the March 11 tsunami.
- The Japan Platform (JPF)—a coordinating body for organizations responding to the tsunami—reported that member organizations have raised more than \$60.3 million in the month since the tsunami, indicating a high level of Japanese and international private support for disaster relief and recovery efforts. Private individuals and organizations have given a total of more than \$525 million for the Japan response—approximately 80

- percent of total assistance—according to the U.N. Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs' Financial Tracking Service.
- Approximately 40 families moved into GoJ-provided transitional housing in Rikuzentakata city, Iwate
 Prefecture, on April 9, representing the first group of affected individuals to move from evacuation centers to
 GoJ transitional housing. According to JPF, transitional housing construction has faced delays in recent weeks,
 as nearly 50 percent of pre-tsunami Japanese plywood production occurred in affected areas of northeastern
 Japan. The GoJ is working to source construction materials and coordinating with Japan Red Cross Society
 (JRCS), which will provide electric appliances for the housing structures.
- The GoJ Ministry of Health, Labor, and Welfare had coordinated the deployment of nearly 300 medical teams to
 affected areas, including 146 teams from the JRCS as of April 8, according to JPF. However, JPF stated that
 emergency medical personnel have begun returning home as medical supply chains recover and health needs
 transition from emergency to long-term.

Logistics and Relief Supplies

 On April 13, Sendai Airport reopened to domestic commercial flights from Tokyo and Osaka. The airport had been operational only for a limited number of humanitarian after sustaining damage during the March 11 tsunami. U.S. Forces-Japan efforts contributed to the reopening of the airport.

Situation at Nuclear Power Plants

- GoJ officials have confirmed that the raising of the International Nuclear Event Scale (INES) rating for the
 Fukushima accident from INES 5 to INES 7 reflects the cumulative measurement of radioactive material
 released to date rather than a recent change in the plant's status. Nuclear experts on the DART note that reactor
 and spent fuel status at the Fukushima Daiichi site have improved slightly in recent days and continue to describe
 the situation as static but not stable.
- The GoJ continues to monitor produce and other food items from northern Japan for radioactivity. Effective
 April 13, the GoJ temporarily banned shipments of shitake mushrooms grown outdoors in five cities, eight
 towns, and three villages in eastern Fukushima Prefecture due to levels of radioactive compounds above
 Japanese safety standards.
- On April 13, the GoJ announced plans to develop guidelines to allow residents of the 20-km exclusion zone
 around the Fukushima Daiichi plant to temporarily return home to retrieve belongings and attend to other
 personal matters. The GoJ guidelines will take into account cumulative radiation levels, the situation at the
 Fukushima plant, and wind direction, and the GoJ will implement the visits with assistance from the Japan SelfDefense Forces and police.
- Under the direction of the GoJ Cabinet Secretariat, U.S. experts and Japanese counterparts regularly discuss
 priority issues and needed assistance. Working together, the experts review scientific and technical data to
 develop solutions to the unique challenges of the Fukushima Daiichi site.



KEY DEVELOPMENTS

- On April 22, the Government of Japan (GoJ) designated the 20-km evacuation zone surrounding the Fukushima
 Daiichi plant as off limits to unauthorized personnel, with plans for the Japan Self-Defense Forces to help
 relocate people currently remaining in the area. To finalize the new designation, the GoJ is planning an
 organized temporary return of evacuees to their homes, in which one person per household would be allowed to
 return for two hours. However, evacuees from within a 3-km radius of the plant would not be permitted to
 return.
- The March 11 earthquake and tsunami have resulted in more than 14,000 deaths and left more than 12,000 people missing, the GoJ reported on April 22. The natural disasters also damaged or destroyed nearly 326,000 buildings and 3,700 roads.
- The number of people staying in evacuation centers continues to decrease, with nearly 131,000 people remaining in centers as of April 22. More than 7,000 people have left evacuation centers since April 15.

CONTEXT

- On March 11 at 0046 hours Eastern Standard Time, or 1446 hours Japan Standard Time, a magnitude 9.0 earthquake occurred off the east coast of Honshu Island—approximately 231 miles northeast of Tokyo—at a depth of approximately 15 miles, generating a tsunami that struck the eastern coast of Japan and resulted in additional fatalities and damage, particularly in Miyagi, Fukushima, and Iwate prefectures. Furthermore, the tsunami significantly damaged the Fukushima Daiichi power plant located approximately 150 miles north of Tokyo, leading to a serious nuclear incident.
- USAID immediately activated a Response Management Team in Washington, D.C., and deployed a Disaster
 Assistance Response Team (DART)—including urban search and rescue (USAR) specialists and nuclear
 experts—to support Japanese emergency response efforts. On March 11, U.S. Ambassador John V. Roos
 declared a disaster due to the effects of the earthquake and tsunami in Japan.

Humanitarian Situation and Response

- On April 21, the DART met with staff from two non-governmental organization (NGO) consortiums—the
 Japanese NGO Center for International Coordination (JANIC) and the Japan Platform (JPF)—which are
 coordinating humanitarian relief efforts in response to the March 11 tsunami. JANIC noted that approximately
 35 international and local NGOs operating in affected areas are coordinating efforts through weekly nationaland local-level meetings led by either JPF or JANIC, representing the majority of NGOs participating in the
 response.
- As a result of an outpouring of private and government support, the majority of NGOs responding to the tsunami
 have reached or exceeded their absorptive capacity for donations, according to JANIC. NGO and GoJ efforts are
 currently meeting material needs in most affected areas, although many organizations will likely require

- assistance with forward financial planning. Ongoing NGO activities include food distribution, sanitation, hygiene, debris removal, volunteer management, and planning for the transition to recovery efforts, according to IPF
- JANIC maintains a fund for distribution to member NGOs responding to the tsunami that are working in the field
 and need resources. Donations to the fund have reached nearly \$54 million to date. In addition, JPF has
 received more than \$67 million and is endeavoring to develop guidelines for a planned grant program to transfer
 funds to appropriate implementing partners.

Health and Protection

- During the month following the tsunami, the Japanese Red Cross Society (JRCS) deployed more than 450 medical teams, as well as radiation specialists from Hiroshima and Nagasaki Red Cross hospitals. The medical teams had treated more than 34,000 patients as of April 12. In addition, JRCS specialists provided mental health services to disaster-affected individuals in hospitals and evacuation centers in Miyagi, Fukushima, and Iwate prefectures. Looking toward the longer term, JRCS also is planning reconstruction of damaged hospitals.
- To increase opportunities for community activities, enhance interpersonal interaction between affected individuals, and address mental health needs, the American Red Cross plans to fund the construction of a series of community centers in areas where temporary housing will be constructed.

Shelter

• As the response begins to move into the recovery phase, the GoJ has commenced construction of a planned 70,000 temporary housing units for displaced individuals. JRCS is equipping the homes with a package of electrical appliances, valued at approximately \$160 million for more than 280,000 beneficiaries. Part of JRCS efforts to help affected families recover from the March 11 disasters, the package includes one refrigerator, washing machine, rice cooker, microwave, television, and hot water dispenser per household.

Situation at Nuclear Power Plants

- The GoJ continues to monitor produce and other food items from northern Japan for radioactivity. The GoJ has banned rice planting within the 20-km off-limits zone.
- Under the direction of the GoJ Cabinet Secretariat, U.S. experts and Japanese counterparts continue to discuss
 priority issues and needed assistance. Working together, the experts review scientific and technical data to
 develop solutions to the unique challenges of the Fukushima Daiichi site.



I have attached, for your information, the latest USAID Administrator's report on Japan and the participant list from the April 26 interagency conference call with Congressional staff. Following is a brief summary of the call.


On April 26, USAID hosted the weekly interagency conference call with Congressional staff on the Japan emergency. Speakers included Mark Bartolini (USAID) and David Hoagland (DOE). Phil Broadbent (FDA) and Barbara Rogers (CDC) were also available to respond to questions. Bartolini stated that there were 14,416 death, 11,709 mission people, and 130,000 people remaining in evacuation centers. He added that land has been secured on which to construct planned shelters for the tsunami displaced families. With the shift from humanitarian relief to recovery and reconstruction, Bartolini said the DART plans to conclude its operations on April 30 and the team leader, Bill Berger, will remain in the region for the next couple of months to facilitate the transition efforts. A cell has been created to continue work with U.S. agencies and the GOJ on the nuclear situation. Hoagland stated that the DOE continues to monitor the situation, collect field measurements, take soil samples, and provide training and support to the GOJ, facilitated by State and USAID. He noted that they are mapping the radiation, and the data shows decreasing radiation levels. There are currently 33 DOE personnel in Japan and a small group at the U.S. embassy. Five Congressional staff participated on the call; they raised questions on the radiation levels, measurements being taken, and location of maps on line.

Our plans are that this will be the final interagency conference call hosted by USAID. We encourage your representatives to participate in this final call. Should questions be raised by Congressional staff, we will defer the questions to the appropriate agency 34431 Congressional offices for reply.





KEY DEVELOPMENTS

- On March 14, the Government of Japan (GoJ) National Police Agency (NPA) reported increased casualty numbers due to the earthquake and tsunami, with the current death toll at 1,897, the number of missing persons at 3,002, and the number of injured at 1,885. Japanese media sources continue to report that the number of fatalities may increase significantly in the coming days as officials recover additional bodies in isolated coastal communities. International media sources have reported that the earthquake and tsunami death toll may be as high as 10,000 individuals.
- Two U.S. urban search and rescue (USAR) teams established a base of operations in Ofunato City—one of the most-affected areas in Iwate Prefecture, on March 14.
- The outer building housing Unit 3 at the Fukushima Dajichi nuclear power plant exploded at approximately 2200 EDT on March 13, or 1100 hours local time on March 14. The explosion injured 11 individuals and released hydrogen gas into the reactor containment building. To date, GoJ officials reported that the reactor containment vessel remains intact and has emitted no major radiation. Nearly 210,000 people remain preemptively evacuated from the vicinities of Fukushima Dajichi and Fukushima Dajini nuclear power plants.
- The Japanese Meteorological Agency (JMA) reported a 70 percent chance that a magnitude 7.0 earthquake may occur near Japan before March 16, with the probability dropping to 50 percent between March 16 and March 19. An estimated 30 aftershocks measuring more than magnitude 6.0 have occurred near Japan since March 11.

CONTEXT

- On March 11 at 0046 hours EST, or 1446 hours local time, a magnitude 8.9 earthquake occurred near the east coast of Honshu—the largest and main island of Japan—at a depth of approximately 15 miles. According to the U.S. Geological Survey (USGS), the epicenter of the earthquake was located 80 miles east of Sendai, the capital of Miyagi Prefecture, and 231 miles northeast of Tokyo. The earthquake also generated a large tsunami that resulted in additional fatalities and damage, particularly in Miyagi, Fukushima, and Iwate prefectures.
- On March 11, U.S. Ambassador to Japan John V. Roos declared a disaster due to the effects of the earthquake
 and tsunami. In response, USAID/OFDA provided an initial \$100,000 through the U.S. Embassy in Tokyo to
 assist with local relief efforts. In addition, USAID activated a Response Management Team (RMT) in
 Washington, D.C., and deployed a DART—including two USAR teams from Fairfax County, Virginia, and Los
 Angeles County, California—to Japan to coordinate USG response and support Japanese USAR efforts.
- InterAction, an alliance of U.S.-based non-governmental organizations, maintains a list of organizations
 accepting donations for the Japanese earthquake response. The American Red Cross (ARC) also receives
 donations through text messages of "redcross" sent to 90999.

Infrastructure and Public Services

- The GoJ NPA reported increased figures for infrastructure damage. To date, the earthquake has damaged or destroyed nearly 60,000 buildings, as well as an estimated 704 roads, 26 bridges, and 8 railways throughout northeastern Japan. Transportation systems remain paralyzed, according to the U.N. Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs (OCHA). In addition, communication services are not functioning for more than 20,000 people in Miyagi and Iwate Prefectures.
- Approximately 371,800 people remain in more than 2,050 GoJ-established emergency evacuation centers
 throughout Japan, according to OCHA. While temperatures drop, disruptions in electrical and gas supplies have
 limited heating for shelters.
- As of March 14, the GoJ reported that approximately 1.25 million households were without electricity and nearly 3.2 million people may be affected by reduced gas supplies in the coming days. According to international media, Tokyo Electric Power has suspended plans to impose rolling power cuts—scheduled to begin in eight prefectures and cities today—but has requested that residents of Tokyo and other areas limit electricity use.
- A fire at the Cosmo Oil Company refinery in Ichihara city, located 25 miles east of Tokyo, continues to burn, despite firefighters' attempts to extinguish the flames since March 11.

USAR Teams

- As of March 14, the Japan Ministry of Defense (MoD) had deployed 60,000 of an expected 100,000 personnel to conduct USAR activities. The MoD had also deployed 96 helicopters, 7 planes, and 58 naval vessels for that purpose.
- On March 14, two USAR teams from Fairfax and Los Angeles counties—composed of 144 personnel and 12 canines trained to detect live victims—traveled from Misawa Air Force Base (AFB) in the northern part of Japan's Honshu Island to Ofunato City, Iwate Prefecture. The teams established a combined base of operations with a United Kingdom USAR team and expect to begin search and rescue operations on March 15.
- As of March 14, Japan has accepted assistance from approximately 15 countries, including USAR teams from China, the Republic of Korea, Singapore, Australia, and New Zealand.
- U.S. Navy aircraft and ships continue to support search and rescue at sea, including conducting aerial surveillance. U.S. Forces-Japan (USFJ) is providing air transport of Japanese Self-Defense Force (JSDF) personnel and vehicles responding to the disaster.
- The USFJ and JSDF are working to establish a Joint Task Force in Yamagata Prefecture in order to establish a
 Civil-Military Operations Center that will coordinate all foreign military aid efforts and establish a refueling
 location for helicopters.

Health

As of March 13, Japanese health officials reported that 552 Japanese Disaster Medical Assistance Teams, comprising five individuals each, were providing medical assistance to disaster-affected individuals. Japanese health officials have also established three staging care units in affected areas and conducted medical evacuations via air. According to OCHA, hospitals are coping with the number of patients, with 145 of 170 designated emergency response hospitals fully functioning.

Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene

- The GoJ reported that an estimated 1.4 million households in 14 prefectures throughout Japan have no access to safe drinking water, according to OCHA. Safe drinking water in tsunami-affected areas is a concern due to water contamination and salination.
- USFJ is providing emergency relief supplies—including safe drinking water and blankets—to affected
 populations.

Dear Chairman Jaczko,

I appreciate your hard work on the nuclear accident at the Fukushima power plant, and your efforts to help the public understand its implications for the American nuclear power fleet. I do want to raise concerns about some aspects of your response, with the hope that you can resolve them fully and quickly.

My concerns stem from the confirmation in response to my staff's inquiries that the Nuclear Regulatory Commission has been operating in a state of emergency since the Tohoku Earthquake on March 11, 2011. In particular, I question whether:

- 1) You may not have followed law as it pertains to the delineation of emergency authority as provided in Reorganization Plan #1 of 1980 (PL 98-614); and
- 2) This action may have reduced the contributions of your experienced colleagues in monitoring the event and in decision-making.

Section 3 of the Reorganization Plan #1 states that the functions transferred to the Chairman are those pertaining to an emergency concerning a particular facility or materials licensed or regulated by the NRC. Your Congressional Affairs staff indicated that you invoked these powers when the NRC Operations Center entered "monitoring mode" at 9:46 AM on March 11th in reaction to the Tohoku Earthquake and resulting potential tsunami threat to U.S. plants. At this time, the crisis is unfolding in Japan and I am not aware that you issued any warnings to any U.S. licensee or regulated facility since March 11th. On the contrary, you have repeatedly stated publicly that U.S. nuclear plants are safe and indicated, as has the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, that any radiation resulting from the Fukushima nuclear accident that reaches the U.S. will not be significant enough to impact public health. Given what has transpired, it would be helpful if you could provide the basis for your invocation of emergency authority.

Secondly, if your basis for invoking emergency authority was the potential threat of a tsunami affecting nuclear plants in California, that threat ceased on March 11th. Please provide your rationale for continuing to exercise emergency authority after March 11th and your

expectations for when and under what conditions you anticipate returning the agency to non-emergency status.

Section 3 of Reorganization Plan #1 also states that the functions transferred to the Chairman in an emergency include declaring, responding, issuing orders, etc., relative to the emergency incident. Since March 28th was the first indication my staff received regarding your exercise of emergency authority—and apparently no public declaration was made--I am concerned that any effort by you to declare an emergency has been less than ideal, especially given your commitment to openness and transparency.

Lastly, Section 3 of Reorganization Plan #1 states that the Chairman shall, to the maximum extent possible, inform the Commission of actions taken relative to the emergency. On March 30, my staff queried all four of your fellow commissioners regarding their knowledge of any such declaration. All four offices indicated that none of the commissioners received any communication from you declaring your intent to exercise emergency powers. It would be helpful if you could provide an explanation as to why the commissioners were apparently not informed of your action.

By April 8th, please provide the information requested above and any legal analysis prepared prior to March 30, 2011 that supports the transfer of functions from the Commission to you including the basis for continuing to exercise those powers.

I look forward to working with you as the NRC addresses the Japan nuclear accident, and to ensure the safety of the nation's nuclear fleet.
