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## General Comment

Re: San Onofre Nuclear Generating Station

I am deeply opposed to the "fast-tracking" of the re-starting of the San Onofre Nuclear Generating Station. This nuclear power plant has major design flaws in its steam generators, which forced the shutting of the plant in the first place. How can the government allow power plant to start up again with the exact same design flaws in place? Southern California Edison has NOT provided clear evidence that they have solved the problem that created a 17% failure rate in the water tubes within the steam generators.

The government should not allow San Onofre to be restarted when it has not re-designed and fully replaced the flawed steam generators. This is one of the most populated regions in the country and the danger of radiation leaks or, heaven forbid, a partial or full meltdown of the plant would wreak havoc, not only to the local population and environment, but the damage would also destroy American's trust in the nuclear industry (making future investment in this sector impossible).

If the Nuclear Regulatory Commission is interested at all in the safety of the American public or the future potential of Nuclear energy in this country, it should NOT allow Southern California Edison to restart the San Onofre generating station until a much more thorough investigation and repair has been conducted.
