AFFIDAVIT

RE: Request for Withholding of the Following Commercial Documents:

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I am the Vice President and Chief Nuclear Officer at Electric Power Research Institute, Inc. whose principal office is located at 3420 Hillview Avenue, Palo Alto, California ("EPRI") and I have been specifically delegated responsibility for the above-listed Report that is sought under this Affidavit to be withheld (the "Report"). I am authorized to apply to the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission ("NRC") for the withholding of the Report on behalf of EPRI.

EPRI requests that the Reports be withheld from the public on the following bases:

Withholding Based Upon Privileged And Confidential Trade Secrets Or Commercial Or Financial Information:

- a. The Report is owned by EPRI and constitutes commercial information which has not been placed in the public domain by EPRI.
- b. EPRI made a substantial economic investment to develop the Reports and, by prohibiting public disclosure, EPRI derives an economic benefit in the form of fees charged for the sale of the Reports. The Reports are entitled to the protection of the United States copyright laws. If the Reports were publicly available to consultants and/or other businesses providing services in the electric and/or nuclear power industry at no cost, these entities would be able to use the Reports for their own commercial benefit and profit and without expending the substantial economic resources required of EPRI to develop the Reports.

- c. EPRI made a substantial investment of both money and employee hours over an extended period of time in the development of the Reports. As a result of such effort and cost, both in terms of dollars spent and dedicated employee time, the Reports are highly valuable to EPRI.
- d. A public disclosure of the Reports would be highly likely to cause substantial harm to EPRI's competitive position and the ability of EPRI to sell the Reports both domestically and internationally. If a party does not purchase the Reports from EPRI, it would require an investment of money, time and effort equivalent to that expended by EPRI for the party to duplicate the Report.

I have read the foregoing and the matters stated herein are true and correct to the best of my knowledge, information and belief. I make this affidavit under penalty of perjury under the laws of the United States of America and under the laws of the State of California.
