Audit Summary for Reviewing Detailed Calculations Supporting WCAP-17577-P, Revision 1, and Request for Additional Information Responses April 23 and 24, 2013

Audit Summary

On April 23 and 24, 2013, the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) staff conducted an audit to review the detailed calculations that supported the Westinghouse Electric Company's (WEC) responses to requests for additional information (RAI)-WSTM-002 and -003.

The audit was conducted by a team of NRC staff members who are knowledgeable in various aspects of the piping and component stress evaluation, fatigue analysis and computer program review. The team spent 2 days at the WEC Twinbrook Office in Rockville, Maryland, auditing materials.

During this audit, WEC presented the responses to RAI-WSTM-002 and -003 and walked through the analysis performed and how it was performed in accordance with the procedure. It was explained how this sample problem provides a sufficient demonstration of the process for reducing conservatism by removing redundant peaks in accordance with the program documentation, when needed for an analysis.

Audit Exit

At the audit exit, staff discussed two action items with WEC:

- The analysis performed for the sample problem created for these RAI responses should be documented in a formal calculation so that it can be referenced in the safety evaluation report.
- The topical report contains several extracted portions from a referenced analysis procedure. How would a change to the analysis procedure impact the topical report?

Regarding the first action item – WEC agreed to document the calculation that was presented during the audit and summarized in the responses to RAIs-002 and -003, into a formal calculation so that it could be referenced by the staff. The calculation number will be CN-PAFM-13-29. Staff expressed that, following the review of the referenced calculation listed above, the response to RAI-WSTM-002 would be considered closed.

The second action item was turned into a supplement to WSTM-003 and submitted to WEC on Friday, April 26, 2013.

• WSTM-003, Supplement 1 - WEC is requested to review the references to the topical report that refer to the NB-3600 procedure and ensure that all the key methodologies and criteria are included in the topical report.

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
