4. VIOLATIONS, NCVs, AND OTHER SAFETY ISSUES:

One violation of NRC regulatory requirements identified

Violation

Title 10 of the Code of Federal Regulations (10 CFR) Part 110.54(b) states, in part, that person making exports under the general license established by 10 CFR 110.23(a) or under a specific license shall submit by February 1 of each year one copy of a report of all americium and neptunium shipments during the previous calendar year. This report shall be submitted to the Deputy Director, Office of International Programs at the

address provided in 10 CFR 110.4. The report must include: (1) A description of the material, including quantity in TBq and gram; (2) Approximate shipment dates; and (3) A list of recipient countries end users, and intended use keyed to the items shipped.

Contrary to the above, between 2010 through 2012, the licensee failed to submit a copy of a report of all americium exports made during the previous calendar year to the NRC. Specifically, the licensee exported sealed sources of Am-241 from its facility in El Paso, Texas, to its manufacturing facility in Juarez, Mexico and failed to report these shipments to the NRC. Additionally the licensee distributed smoke detectors containing sealed sources of Am-241 from its facility in El Paso, Texas, to various non-embargoed countries, and failed to report these shipments to the NRC.
