This refers to your license amendment request dated April 4, 2013. Enclosed with this letter is the amended license removing the requested authorized users and in vitro use and correcting the room identification for your decay storage room. We noted from the letterhead on your letter dated April 4, 2013, that your facility may have undergone a name change. Please review the information in Appendix F of NUREG-1556, Volume 15 immediately and document any changes in ownership that may have occurred at your facility. Additionally, you may document in a letter to the NRC the change in name and confirm that no ownership changes have occurred as described in NUREG-1556, Vol. 15.

Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand and fully implement all the conditions incorporated into the amended license. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Region I Office, Licensing Assistance Team, (610) 337-5239, so that we can provide appropriate corrections and answers.

An environmental assessment for this action is not required, since this action is categorically excluded under 10 CFR 51.22(c)(14).
