PROGRAM SCOPE								
Bomarko, In. obtained an assembly line containing two generally licensed gauges through the liquidation of assets from Zimmer Custom Made Packaging located at 1450 E. 20th Street, Indianapolis, IN. The radioactive gauges were not noticed for several weeks at the Bomarko location. When Bomarko became aware of the gauges which contained 150 mCi Am-241 each, they notified NRC and the gauge manufacturer NDC. On June 17, 2013, NDC picked up those two gauges and exchanged them for three similar gauges.  NDC left these gauges in a cardboard box in an office. On June 19, 2013, the NRC inspector observed the gauges and								
ensure that the gauges were secured in a locked cabinet, until NDC can bring these gauges back to its facility for testing and reconditioning.								
Bomarko had obtained these gauges by accident after they had purchased a packaging line of equipment at a bankruptcy sale at Zimmer Custom Made Packaging in Indianapolis, Indiana. Bomarko contacted NRC and informed NRC of the fact that Bomarko had possession of these gauges illegally and requested assistance. The manufacturer of the gauges NDC, then exchanged the two gauges at Bomarko with three gauges required at Bomarko.								
All thirteen gls from the Zimmer Custom Packaging site have been accounted for. (6 at Zimmer going for disposal; 2 in Mexico, 2 at Parker Equipment movers, 3 at Bomarko). The gauges form Bomarko are being registered by the licensee and sent in to NRC HQ. Two of the gauges went to Mexico. The remaining gauges will be either disposed of or returned to the manufacturer (NDC).
