Per your amendment request dated April 5, 2013, the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) was notified of your intent about a proposed change of ownership for activities authorized under NRC license 11-27658-01. The enclosure contains guidance on the type of information that needs to be submitted to the NRC as a license amendment request to allow for the review and approval of the proposed change of ownership. In addition, please note that the NRC does not list an "Assistant Radiation Safety Officer" on a license. The Radiation Safety Officer (RSO) is responsible for the overall management of the radiation safety program; identifying radiation safety problems, initiating, recommending or providing corrective actions; verifying implementation of corrective actions; ensuring compliance with the Commission's rules and regulations and conditions of the license. An RSO should actively participate in the day-to-day management of the radiation safety program. Although the performance of certain radiation safety tasks may be delegated by the RSO to other individuals (such as an alternate Radiation Safety Officer), the responsibility for the overall effectiveness of the radiation safety program and for compliance with NRC rules and regulations and conditions of the license reside with the RSO. Therefore, we will not act on your request to add Mr. Steve Husted as an assistant RSO.

## Change of Control and/or Change of Ownership (Includes Change of Name)

10 CFR 30.34(b) states that "no license issued or granted pursuant to the regulations...nor any right under a license shall be transferred, assigned or in any manner disposed of, either voluntarily or involuntarily, directly or indirectly, through transfer of control of any license to any person, unless the Commission shall...find that the transfer is in accordance with the provisions of the Act and shall give its consent in writing. Although not specifically addressed by 10 CFR 30.34, licensees undergoing a name change may also be affected by this regulation.

Control over licensed activities can be construed as the authority to decide when and how a license (licensed material and/or activities) will be used. A change of ownership may be an example of a change of control. The central issue is whether the authority over the license has changed. In all cases, determining whether a change of control has taken place or whether a change is in name only is the Commission's responsibility.

Licensees must notify the Commission when they are undergoing a possible change of control and/or a change of name. While this notification is not required within a certain time frame, NRC needs adequate time to review the submittal to ensure that the transfer is in accordance with the regulations.
