Dear Dr. Wang:

Enclosed is Amendment No. 23 to your NRC Material License No. 13-32241-01 in accordance with your request. **We have also revised Items 7.F. and 9.F., in accordance with revisions to the Sealed Source and Device Registry, and removed Condition 16, as listed on the most recent amendment to this license, in accordance with current licensing policy.** Please note that the changes made to your license are printed in **bold** font.

In reviewing your June 3, 2013, letter, we noted that Gordon Watson, M.D., was approved previously to work as an Authorized User under an agreement state license. The referenced license, Utah License No. UT 1800494, authorized a different model Iridium-192 source from that authorized on your license, NRC License No. 13-32241-01. **At the time of your next amendment request to NRC, please confirm, via statement or other documentation, that Dr. Watson has received device-specific training on your Nucletron model 106.990 unit.** No response to this letter is required, at this time.

Finally, we have noted that the letter dated March 20, 2013, included a request to remove the 1346 East County Line Road location of use from your license. The NRC staff has reviewed final status surveys for the 1346 East County Line Road location. Based on its review, the staff has concluded that this facility is suitable for unrestricted use.

Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. NRC, Region III office at (630) 829-9887 so that we can provide appropriate corrections and answers.

You will be periodically inspected by NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you. This could include issuance of a notice of violation, or imposition of a civil penalty, or an order suspending, modifying or revoking your license as specified in the General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions. Since serious consequences to employees and the public can result from failure to comply with NRC requirements, prompt and vigorous enforcement action will be taken when dealing with licensees who do not achieve the necessary meticulous attention to detail and the high standard of compliance which NRC expects of its licensees.
