This responds to your final supplemental report to your June 2013, plant-specific Supplement 38 to NUREG-1437, "Generic Environmental Impact Statement for License Renewal of Nuclear Plants" (GEIS), regarding the license renewal of Indian Point Nuclear Generating Unit Nos. 2 and 3 (IP2 and IP3). This is a supplement to the FSEIS you published in December 2010.

We have reviewed the document and have no substantive comments. The description of the information that has become available since the FSEIS was published is consistent with our understanding of the available information. Also, the description of the Endangered Species Act section 7 consultation that was completed in January 2013 appears complete and accurate. As you know, we continue to work with NRC staff as Entergy develops a monitoring plan for impingement of shortnose and Atlantic sturgeon as required by the Incidental Take Statement issued as part of our January 30, 2013, Biological Opinion.
