**PROGRAM SCOPE**

The licensee was a private practice cardiac clinic authorized to use licensed material permitted by Section 35.200 at two authorized locations of use. The licensee employed two part-time technologists who performed approximately 20-40 diagnostic nuclear procedures per month. Nuclear medicine studies were typically performed Mondays at the Bloomfield Hills clinic and Fridays at the Hamtramck site. The licensee received unit doses from a licensed radiopharmacy. The licensee retained the services of a consulting physicist who audited the radiation safety program on a quarterly basis (last 6/19/2013, with no violations or findings).

This inspection consisted of interviews with licensee personnel, a review of selected records, tour of the nuclear medicine department, and independent measurements. No patient studies were performed on the day of this inspection.
