This refers to your license amendment request dated June 24, 2013. Enclosed with this letter is the amended license suspending medical use and authorizing storage-only of licensed material at Bridgeport, West Virginia. An amendment requesting authorization of medical use must be submitted and approved before activities can resume. In addition, please note the corrective actions previously agreed to during the exit meeting on June 25, 2013 to amend your license and add a facility in Buckhannon, West Virginia will not be processed while you maintain a storage-only status.

Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand and fully implement all the conditions incorporated into the amended license. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Region I Office, Licensing Assistance Team, (610) 337-5239, so that we can provide appropriate corrections and answers.

An environmental assessment for this action is not required, since this action is categorically excluded under 10 CFR 51.22(c)(14).
