

- (1) Letter dated March 29, 2013 to the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (“NRC”) from Canberra Industries, Inc. (“Canberra U.S.”) and FCPR Astorg V (“Astorg V”), jointly requesting the written consent of the NRC to the transfer of indirect control of Materials License Numbers 06-15099-01, 06-15099-03E and 41-14168-01E from Areva NC, Inc. (“Areva”) to Astorg V as a result of the anticipated purchase and sale of 100% of the share capital of Canberra U.S. from Areva to Astorg V (the “Request Letter”); and
- (2) Letter dated June 11, 2013, to Canberra U.S. from the NRC stating that the NRC has no objection to the consummation of such proposed transfer of indirect control described in (1) above (the “Approval Letter”).

Canberra U.S. is writing to inform the NRC that the transaction described in the Request Letter, whereby Astorg V would be transferred indirect control of the above referenced licenses as a result of the purchase and sale of 100% of the share capital of Canberra U.S., has been terminated and will not be consummated. Such licenses will remain under the indirect control of Areva. Thank you with your assistance in these matters.
