
This letter is in response to your letter (received via email) dated 10/31/12 regarding the proposed Crow Butte ISR license renewal and North Trend, Marsland and Three Crow Projects.

Standing Rock Sioux Tribe THPO objects to the approach set forth in your letter and instead proposes that Cameco hire one third-party contractor *selected by participating tribes* to coordinate and conduct the field study with field crew from participating tribes and to write the report. To ensure that the field work is conducted in a manner that is acceptable to consulting tribes and to addresses concerns raised by SRST-THPO in earlier consultations with NRC, the field study must be guided by a Scope-Of-Work drafted by *both* NRC and consulting tribes. The area to be surveyed, survey method to be employed and contents of the report should be clearly delineated and addressed in the SOW. Once the SOW has been agreed upon by all consulting tribes, it should be presented to applicant and third-party contractor and the applicant and contractor can negotiate compensation for the survey-work and survey report based on the SOW.

To invite tribes to conduct a field study before concerns about APE have been addressed is premature and dismissive of concerns raised by SRST-THPO and other tribes under 800.4(a). As you are aware, we have already put effort into the revision of a scope-of-work for other NRC projects in the area; it is suggested that you build on, rather than ignore, comments and efforts put forth by our office to date.

The proposal and short timeframe outlined by the applicant in your letter of 10/31 was not made in consultation with participating consulting tribes and in fact does not address concerns that we have raised regarding the process for identification. Pursuant to 36CFR880.2 (c)(2)(ii)(A) participating tribes have a right to advise the agency on how the identification of historic properties of significance to us will be achieved. It is our position that a jointly drafted SOW that outlines how identification efforts will proceed would go a long way in addressing this concern.
