Enclosed is Amendment No. 34 to your NRC Material License No. 21-24652-01 in accordance with your request. Please note that the major changes made to your license are printed in **bold** font.

Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Region III office at (630) 829-9887 so that we can provide appropriate corrections and answers.

In this amendment we added "Gregg Warren, D.O." as an authorized user. Please note the spelling of his first name is "Gregg," because that is the spelling used when he was named to your license on Amendment No. 32. Your letter dated May 8, 2013, showed his name spelled "Greg." Please advise us if his name is misspelled on this license.

In my conversation record to your consultant, Thomas M. Kumpuris, dated July 17, 2013, I requested information to update the format for Subitem No. 8.C. on your license, as well as your direct telephone number, email address and fax number, to better facilitate our ability to reach you.

In Mr. Kumpuris' letter to us dated July 18, 2013, we received most of the requested information but we did not receive your fax number. Please provide your fax number to us in a future amendment request. Your cooperation in this matter is greatly appreciated.

We also deleted Condition No. 13, as it appeared on Amendment No. 33 because it was no longer necessary for your license.

In accordance with 10 CFR 2.390 of the NRC's "Rules of Practice," a copy of this letter and its enclosure will be available electronically for public inspection in the NRC Public Document Room or from the NRC's Agencywide Documents Access and Management System (ADAMS), accessible from the NRC Web site at http://www.nrc.gov/reading-rm/adams.html.

You will be periodically inspected by NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you. This could include issuance of a notice of violation, or imposition of a civil penalty, or an order

suspending, modifying or revoking your license as specified in the General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions.

Since serious consequences to employees and the public can result from failure to comply with NRC requirements, prompt and vigorous enforcement action will be taken when dealing with licensees who do not achieve the necessary meticulous attention to detail and the high standard of compliance which NRC expects of its licensees.

The NRC's Safety Culture Policy Statement became effective in June 2011. While a policy statement and not a regulation, it sets forth the agency's *expectations* for individuals and organizations to establish and maintain a positive safety culture.
