Dear Mr. Gausewitz:

Enclosed is Amendment No. 08 to your NRC Material License No. 21-15281-02 in accordance with your request. Please note that the changes made to your license are printed in **bold** font.

Please note that License Condition 20 as it appeared on Correct Copy of Amendment No. 07, regarding the decommissioning financial assurance requirement was removed because the condition is no longer necessary.

Also, License Condition 23 has been updated to use the more current language and has been renumbered as License Condition 18. In addition, please note that the possession limits on your license have been corrected to the maximum activity allowed by the Sealed Source Device Registry.

We noted that your letter dated April 19, 2013, included another complete application. This was unnecessary and placed a greater regulatory burden on you and on us. For future reference, when you are only amending parts of your license, you only need to submit information changing and supporting those affected parts. When renewing your license, submission of a complete application is recommended.

Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Region III office at (630) 829-9887 so that we can provide appropriate corrections and answers.


You will be periodically inspected by NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you. This could include issuance of a notice of violation, or imposition of a civil penalty, or an order suspending, modifying or revoking your license as specified in the General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions. Since serious consequences to employees and the public can result from failure to comply with NRC requirements, prompt and vigorous enforcement action will be taken when dealing with licensees who do not achieve the necessary meticulous attention to detail and the high standard of compliance which NRC expects of its licensees.

The NRC's Safety Culture Policy Statement became effective in June 2011. While a policy statement and not a regulation, it sets forth the agency's *expectations* for individuals and

organizations to establish and maintain a positive safety culture.
