Dear Mr. Harter:

Enclosed is Amendment No. 11 renewing your NRC Material License No. 13-17217-01 in accordance with your request.

Please note that your response letter dated May 29, 2013, for the removal of the Texas Nuclear Model Number 5197 gauges was not adequate in that it did not provide the most current leak test results for these gauges. Therefore, the Texas Nuclear Model Number 5197 gauge will remain on your license. To remove this gauge model from your license, please submit a request, addressed to me and referencing Control Number 579829, to remove the gauge model. Please provide the documentation showing these devices have been properly transferred, including the last leak test results prior to transfer in 2004 and a copy of the license for the company receiving the gauges, Thermo Electron Corporation.

In addition, in letter dated May 29, 2013, you stated that within 30 days of naming a new Radiation Safety Officer you will notify the NRC of the change. Please note that the NRC must be notified and the amendment to your license must be made prior to changing the RSO. When requesting to change the RSO, please include the name and qualifications of your proposed RSO and a written, signed (by both senior management and the proposed RSO) and a currently dated statement that stipulates the proposed RSO accepts the position and understands the duties and responsibilities associated with the position. Each proposed RSO must be qualified in accordance with the guidance in NUREG 1556, Vol 1, Rev. 1, Section 8.7, Item 7: 'Individual(s) Responsible for Radiation Safety Program and Their Training and Experience.'

Also, please note that License Condition 24 as it appeared on Correct Copy of Amendment No. 10, regarding the decommissioning financial assurance requirement was removed because the condition is no longer necessary.

Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Region III office at (630) 829-9887 so that we can provide appropriate corrections and answers.

You will be periodically inspected by NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you. This could include issuance of a notice of violation, or imposition of a civil penalty, or an order suspending, modifying or revoking your license as specified in the General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions. Since serious consequences to employees and the public can result from failure to comply with NRC requirements, prompt and vigorous

enforcement action will be taken when dealing with licensees who do not achieve the necessary meticulous attention to detail and the high standard of compliance which NRC expects of its licensees.

The NRC's Safety Culture Policy Statement became effective in June 2011. While a policy statement and not a regulation, it sets forth the agency's *expectations* for individuals and organizations to establish and maintain a positive safety culture.
