Dear Phil,

I hope you are well.

Joe Rivers suggested that I contact you. My "L" clearance is going to expire later this year because I have had it for ten years. I obtained it originally through my involvement in the ASLB hearings on the MOX fuel fabrication plant. The hearing is finally winding to a close, however, so it is unlikely that the ASLB will sponsor renewal of my clearance. However, if I lose it I will no longer be able to participate at the same level in the ISFSI security rulemaking process.

So my question to you is this: do you think it might be possible for you or another NSIR representative to sponsor the renewal of my clearance so that I can continue to serve as a stakeholder as the technical basis for the rulemaking continues to be developed? I know this would be unusual but this has been a fairly unique situation, since as far as I know there are few members of the public who have had the opportunity to participate as stakeholders in classified settings at the NRC.

I'd very much appreciate any thoughts or suggestions you have on this matter.
