Dear Ms. Greene:

Enclosed are Amendment Nos. 09 and 33 to your NRC Materials License Nos. 13-32519-01 and 13-16680-01, respectively, in accordance with your request. Please note that the changes made to your licenses are printed in **bold font**.

Please note that from review of your letters dated June 21, 2013 for each of these licenses, we have determined that a change-of-control did not occur. Therefore, no consent is necessary from the NRC. Since this transaction constituted only a change in name of these licensed facilities, the enclosed amendments reflect the new name as discussed in your letters dated June 21, 2013.

Please also note that Item No. 8.C. of each license was amended to reflect a total possession limit for 10 CFR 35.300 materials authorized under each license. These changes were made due to a NRC policy change and I discussed the matter with the Radiation Safety Officer of both licenses, Arti Raj, M.D., by telephone on August 1, 2013, who agreed to the changes.



You will be periodically inspected by NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you. This could include issuance of a notice of violation, or imposition of a civil penalty, or an order suspending, modifying or revoking your license as specified in the General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions. Since serious consequences to employees and the public can result from failure to comply with NRC requirements, prompt and vigorous enforcement action will be taken when dealing with licensees who do not achieve the necessary meticulous attention to detail and the high standard of compliance which NRC expects of its licensees.

The NRC's Safety Culture Policy Statement became effective in June 2011. While a policy statement and not a regulation, it sets forth the agency's *expectations* for individuals and organizations to establish and maintain a positive safety culture.
